

Massive Surge

... in support for LTU campaign against Bank's 'Jobs To India' plans.

Over the last two weeks there has been a massive surge in support for LTU's campaign to stop existing Lloyds TSB jobs being transferred to India.

This support has come from many quarters, including Members of Parliament who have condemned the Bank's plans.

In a parliamentary debate, David Clelland, the MP for Newcastle Central with whom LTU has been working closely, asked a Government Minister...

"Does he think that Lloyds TSB should have some loyalty to this country and its employees?"

He also insisted that...

"With thousands of jobs under threat and others haemorrhaging from this country as a result of offshoring, surely the Government have to do something"

Two Early Day Motions have also been submitted to Parliament by MPs supporting LTU's campaign.



The media - television, radio and newspapers - have extensively reported on LTU's campaign to save UK jobs.

In a listeners phone poll at one radio station's breakfast programme on which a representative of LTU appeared, a massive 98.8% of listeners said they were opposed to work being transferred to India at the expense of UK jobs.



The Bank's customers have been signing LTU's Petition in their thousands to oppose the transfer of work abroad.

90% of those approached outside branches have queued to sign the petition, and other customers have made special trips to their branches after hearing details in the media of where LTU is petitioning. The Union is well over half way toward its target of collecting half a million signatures.



Membership surges on support for LTU's campaign.

It's not just public support for LTU's campaign that's surged. Membership has risen rapidly as members recognise that LTU is the only union with the resources and commitment to run an effective campaign opposing the transfer of existing jobs to India.
